School Sports Funding (Sport Premium)

Background Information about the funding (from the DfE website)

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Eligible schools funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11), as recorded in the annual schools census in January 2014. Purpose of funding schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- ✓ hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- ✓ supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- ✓ providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport.
- ✓ running sport competitions, or increasing pupils’ participation in the School Games.
- ✓ buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport.
- ✓ providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
- ✓ pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

Accountability from September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school’s overall provision.

One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year’s expenditure of additional funding and its impact.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

How is Nyewood using the Sports Premium?

The primary objective for the 2014/2015 academic year is to continue to improve the provision of PE and sport.

Nyewood is now into the second year of this funding and the majority has again been spent on Continued Professional Development (CPD) for the teaching staff. Last year, each teacher had Gymnastics coaching in order to improve the delivery of it across the school. This year, each teacher could choose the area that they wanted CPD in. So far this year, Dance has been a popular choice! The school has used the funding to buy in a specialist outstanding Dance coach from The Regis School.

Each class teacher will receive a half term of coaching. This coaching will be delivered in curriculum time and the teachers will team teach with the specialist. This will allow each teacher to develop their subject knowledge and improve their confidence in all aspects of their chosen area. Going forward, this funding will have provided each teacher with the knowledge and skills to improve the standard of teaching for future classes. This coaching is reviewed and evaluated termly.

Ways the Sports Premium funding is planned to be spent include:

- ✓ Subscription to West Sussex School Sports Package **(£6800)**
- ✓ Providing the resources for Healthy Eating Club. **(£250)**
- ✓ Buying in coaches to take extracurricular clubs in the summer term. **(£ 250)**
- ✓ Purchasing of new sports equipment**(£968)**
- ✓ Funding hours of a Teaching Assistant to ensure effective administration of pupils participation in competitive sporting fixtures and competition.**(£394)**
- ✓ Paying a subsidy for transport, pool hire and instruction by qualified coaches for swimming lessons. **(£ 300)**
- ✓ Developing the use of Providing Playground Activity Leaders (PAL) and training for midday supervisors to introduce playground games at lunchtimes.**(£ 200)**

Possible other planned actions include, if funds allow:-

- ✓ Subsidising the entry fees for competitive sporting events.
- ✓ Identifying areas of need for PE and sports clubs then employing a local coach to provide an extracurricular club, for example in gymnastics.
- ✓ Providing opportunities for pupils to engage in intra (in school) and inter (against other schools) sports competitions internally or against other schools in the Felpham and Bognor area.

- ✓ Enabling pupils to attend sporting festivals and competitions by releasing teachers to supervise.
- ✓ Monitoring the percentage of pupils that attend a PE or Sporting extra curricular club, festival or competition and ensuring that opportunities are given to all pupils.
- ✓ Working closely with the local Sport Games Organiser to provide pupils the opportunity to participate in larger scale competitions such as the Netball and Football Tournaments and Area Athletics Championships.
- ✓ Using local secondary schools' expertise and providing pupils who are gifted and talented in sports (Future Flyers) with expert and intensive training.
- ✓ Activity day that Year 6 pupils attend at The Regis School.
- ✓ Establishing strong and sustainable links with local community sports clubs such as Bognor Regis Cricket Club.
- ✓ Releasing staff to attend CPD courses such as The Primary PE Conference and Working towards outstanding PE Lessons to develop further skills and knowledge. Feedback on these will be given to all staff members so that the impact can be school wide.
- ✓ Establishing a shared enjoyment by all for PE and Sports by engaging pupils in whole school sporting events such as the annual Fun Run, Sports Day and other national events such as, Sports Relief and National School Sports Week.
- ✓ Working towards achieving the National Kitemark Award by releasing staff to measure the opportunities, involvement, impact and enjoyment of pupils throughout the school year.

The impact of the Sport Premium Funding for 2013/2014

Last year the funding was used to help in the provision and delivery of Gymnastics across the school. As a result, the teaching has improved and staff are more confident in this area of PE.

In addition, the funding was also used to help pay for extracurricular clubs, such as Cricket where a professional coach came into school during curriculum time to team teach a half term of cricket as well as providing an after school club for 30 children. We hope this will happen again this summer.

The Healthy Eating club also benefited from this funding as £500 was provided, with which resources were provided for the weekly cookery club.

Part of the funding was used to ensure all the Year 6 who needed 'Top Up' Swimming sessions, were able to attend in order to meet the National Curriculum requirements.

The Governors are satisfied with how the funding has been spent in the year 2013/2014.
