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### School Sports Funding (Sport Premium)

The dedicated primary [PE and Sport Premium](#), which was announced in March 2013 and began the following September, goes directly to primary school head teachers so that they can decide how best to use it to provide sporting activities for pupils.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Eligible schools funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11), as recorded in the annual schools census in January 2015. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- ✓ Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- ✓ Supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- ✓ Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport.
- ✓ Running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games.
- ✓ Introduce new and unusual sports like fencing, climbing, ultimate frisbee and Danish long-ball to encourage more children to enjoy sport
- ✓ Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport.
- ✓ Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
- ✓ Pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

Schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors



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Handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

### How is Nyewood CE Juniors using the Sports Premium?

The primary objective for the 2017/2018 academic year is to continue to improve the provision of PE and sport.

Nyewood is now into the fifth year of this funding and we have used it predominately to pay the entry fees for Sporting Competitions and buying resources. Nyewood has entered more events than last year and will continue to do so! We have bought more resources for PE lessons, school kits for Netball and Football and equipment for the playground shed for the children to use at lunchtime.

We are committed to provide Continued Professional Development (CPD) for the teaching staff, sending members of staff on courses to improve the teaching of P.E. in school.

Other ways the Sports Premium funding is planned to be spent this academic year include:

- ✓ Hiring a new P.E. Leader to oversee the P.E. provision (including extra-curricular) at Nyewood CE Juniors.
- ✓ Buying in coaches to take extracurricular clubs, including table tennis and cricket - £500
- ✓ Paying for a specialist coach to provide a Gymnastics club.
- ✓ Providing opportunities for pupils to engage in intra (in school) and inter (against other schools) sports competitions internally or against other schools in the Felpham and Bognor area.
- ✓ Enabling pupils to attend sporting festivals and competitions by releasing teachers to supervise - £320
- ✓ Monitoring the percentage of pupils that attend a PE or Sporting extracurricular club, festival or competition and ensuring that opportunities are given to all pupils.
- ✓ Working closely with the local Sport Games Organiser to provide pupils the opportunity to participate in larger scale competitions such as the Netball and Football Tournaments and Area Athletics Championships - £1,800
- ✓ Using local secondary schools' expertise and providing pupils who are gifted and talented in sports (Future Flyers) with expert and intensive training.
- ✓ Activity day that Year 6 pupils attend at The Regis School.
- ✓ Establishing strong and sustainable links with local community sports clubs such as Bognor Regis Cricket Club, Football Club and Rugby Club.

- ✓ Releasing staff to attend CPD courses such as The Primary PE Conference and Working towards outstanding PE Lessons to develop further skills and knowledge. Feedback on these will be given to all staff members so that the impact can be school wide - £1,800
- ✓ Developing the use of Providing Playground Activity Leaders (PAL) and training for midday supervisors to introduce playground games at lunchtimes.
- ✓ Establishing a shared enjoyment by all for PE and Sports by engaging pupils in whole school sporting events such as the annual Fun Run, Sports Day and other national events such as, Sports Relief and National School Sports Week.
- ✓ Paying a subsidy for transport, pool hire and instruction by qualified coaches for swimming lessons for Years 5 and 6 - £400
- ✓ Purchasing school football kit and JRock competition t-shirts - £1,675
- ✓ Purchasing PE resources and maintenance/ inspection of equipment.
- ✓ Introducing a staff P.E. kit to be worn when teaching P.E.
- ✓ Setting up a Youth Sports Leaders programme including the training of 16 selected children.

#### The impact of the Sport Premium Funding for 2016/2017

Last year the funding was used to help in the provision and delivery of football and cricket across the school. As a result, the teaching has improved and staff are more confident in these areas of P.E.

In addition, the funding was also used to help pay for extracurricular clubs, the participation of children in extracurricular sports clubs has increased by .... There is also a wider choice of clubs for children to choose from.

The introduction of new extracurricular activities such as JRock has offered a large amount of children the opportunity to perform and interact with their peers. JRock has increased the confidence and behaviour of vulnerable children by giving them further responsibility within the school.

#### Planned impact of the Sport Premium Funding for 2017/2018

The introduction of Sports Leaders should encourage Year 6 children to take on further responsibility amongst their peers.

The further introduction and training of Playground Leaders will give all children an opportunity to have someone to play with at lunchtime. Playground Leaders should be supervised by the newly appointed Sports Leader TA and will be given further training in new games by our Sports Leaders.

We will enter the Junior Rock Challenge Competition for the second year, increasing participation of **all** children.

Further swimming lessons will ensure that all Year 6 children can swim 25m by the end of primary school, meeting national guidelines.
