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At Nyewood C.E. Junior School we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

School Sports Funding (Sport Premium)

The dedicated primary [PE and Sport Premium](#), which was announced in March 2013 and began the following September, goes directly to primary school head teachers so that they can decide how best to use it to provide sporting activities for pupils.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Eligible schools funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11), as recorded in the annual schools census in January. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision and to increase participation in PE and Sport.

Schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors Handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

### **During 2015/16 the Sport Premium funding was used to:**

- Provide curriculum support x1 afternoon per week from qualified coach FA coach for football CPD.
- Provide extracurricular clubs. (Reviewed termly), including, netball, football, badminton, table-tennis and cricket.
- Provide supply cover for teachers to accompany teams to inter school sports competitions, taster session and dance festivals.
- New sports equipment, including better, sports clothing, a range of sports specific balls including basketball.
- Fund an activity day for Year 6 that is held at The Regis
- Provide Top-up swimming sessions for Year 6
- Paying a subsidy for pool hire and instruction by qualified coaches for swimming lessons for Year 4 and 6

- Releasing staff to attend CPD sessions
- Using local secondary schools' expertise and providing pupils who are gifted and talented in sports (Future Flyers) with expert and intensive training
- Purchasing school netball kit including track-suits, bibs and netballs, and school cricket kit - £1,675

### **The impact of the Sport Premium Funding for 2015/2016**

Last year the funding was used to help in the provision and delivery of Dance across the school. The children and staff benefitted from the expertise of a FA coach who led Football for staff development. These were very valuable in that teachers learnt new skills which they were able to share with colleagues. As a result, the teaching has improved and staff are more confident in this area of P.E.

In addition, the funding was also used to help pay for extracurricular clubs, such as Cricket where a professional coach came into school during curriculum time to team teach a half term of cricket to two Year 3/4 classes, as well as providing an after school club for 30 children.

The Healthy Eating club also benefited from this funding as £500 was provided, with which resources were provided for the weekly cookery club.

Part of the funding was used to ensure all the Year 6 who needed 'Top Up' Swimming sessions, were able to attend in order to meet the National Curriculum requirements.

The Sports Premium money also enabled us to provide more after school club sports to appeal to a greater number of children. We managed to improve levels of involvement and be more inclusive, for example, more girls joined in with football club we had a specific lunchtime clubs for the girls during the spring term.

The money also allowed us to take small groups of children from all years to a number of taster days covering a variety of sports. Children who were not so confident in some of the individual sports had the opportunity to attend taster sessions where they mixed with children from other local schools in a range of activities, including football, netball, gymnastics, dance and athletics.

As a result of our dedication to promoting PE and school sport we are pleased to announce that we achieved the Sainsbury's School Games Silver Kite Mark for 2015-16.

## **Planned Expenditure 2016/17**

We are committed to provide Continued Professional Development (CPD) for the teaching staff and have had a Football Association (F.A.) qualified skills coach team teaching P.E. lessons with the class teacher. This has improved teacher knowledge and skill to improve their teaching and delivery of P.E. This coaching is reviewed and evaluated termly.

Other ways the Sports Premium funding is planned to be spent this academic year include:

- ✓ Subsidising the entry fees for competitive sporting events - £800
- ✓ Buying in coaches to take extracurricular clubs, including table tennis and cricket - £800
- ✓ Continue to paying for a specialist coach to provide an afterschool Gymnastics club.
- ✓ Providing opportunities for pupils to engage in intra (in school) and inter (against other schools) sports competitions internally or against other schools in the Felpham and Bognor area.
- ✓ Enabling pupils to attend sporting festivals and competitions by releasing teachers to supervise - £320
- ✓ Monitoring the percentage of pupils that attend a PE or Sporting extracurricular club, festival or competition and ensuring that opportunities are given to all pupils.
- ✓ Working closely with the local Sport Games Organiser to provide pupils the opportunity to participate in larger scale competitions such as the Netball and Football Tournaments and Area Athletics Championships - £1,800
- ✓ Using local secondary schools' expertise and providing pupils who are gifted and talented in sports (Future Flyers) with expert and intensive training.
- ✓ Activity day that Year 6 pupils attend at The Regis School.
- ✓ Establishing strong and sustainable links with local community sports clubs such as Bognor Regis Cricket Club.
- ✓ Releasing staff to attend CPD courses such as The Primary PE Conference and Working towards outstanding PE Lessons to develop further skills and knowledge. Feedback on these will be given to all staff members so that the impact can be school wide - £1,800
- ✓ Developing the use of Providing Playground Activity Leaders (PAL) and training for midday supervisors to introduce playground games at lunchtimes - £250
- ✓ Establishing a shared enjoyment by all for PE and Sports by engaging pupils in whole school sporting events such as the annual Fun Run, Sports Day and other national events such as, Sports Relief and National School Sports Week.

- ✓ Paying a subsidy for pool hire and instruction by qualified coaches for swimming lessons for Years 4 and 6 - £400
- ✓ Working towards achieving the Gold National Kitemark Award
- ✓ Purchasing school netball kit including track-suits, bibs and netballs, and school cricket kit - £1,675
- ✓ Purchasing PE resources and maintenance and inspection of equipment - £1,230
